## Section 3.12 Traffic Calming

The Department of Municipal Development operates the City of Albuquerque Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP). The purpose of the program is to address speeding and cut-through traffic on local residential streets using a set of traffic-calming tools. These include physical tools, such as lane narrowing, turn restrictions, curb bulb-outs, and speed dips, as well as non-physical tools like radar speed signs and targeted enforcement. Some traffic calming tools (speed humps, bulb-outs, lane narrowing, etc.) will reduce the hydraulic capacity of streets and may cause flows to exceed curb height. A hydraulic analysis of street flows may be required by the city hydrologist prior to construction.
