

Human Rights Office

City Ordinance (11-3-1) was enacted in January 1974 and is administered by the City of Albuquerque Human Rights Board through the Office of Diversity and Human Rights (ODHR).

The Ordinance prohibits discrimination on the basis of the following:

- Race,
- Color,
- Religion,
- Sex,
- National origin,
- Age,
- Physical handicap
- and other protected categories under state and federal law.

The ODHR is actively working on projects related to pay equity, U-Visas, Native American Task Force, mental health initiatives, community-police dialogues, intimate partner violence, medical student training etc.

Diversity and Outreach

The staff of the Office of Diversity and Human Rights works in partnership with public and private agencies, social service agencies and community organizations representing or providing services to minorities, women, individuals with disabilities, youth and seniors to promote equality and awareness on human/civil rights issues, and to reduce inter-group tension and hostility.
