NOTIFICATION OF DECISION

MICHELLE OTTERNESS (CHRISTOPHER BECCONE, AGENT) requests a special exception to Section 14-16-2-23 and 14-16-2-15(B)(9) pg 99 NOBHILL HIGHLANDS SDP : a CONDITIONAL USE to allow for the sale of wine and beer on premise only for all or a portion of Lot 24, Block 42, University Heights zoned OR-1, located on 3216 SILVER AV SE (K-16)

On the 17th day of November, 2015 (hereinafter “**Hearing**”) CHRISTOPHER BECCONE, (hereinafter “**Agent**”) acting as agent on behalf of the property owner MICHELLE OTTERNESS (hereinafter “**Applicant**”) appeared before the Zoning Hearing Examiner (hereinafter “**ZHE**”) requesting a Conditional Use to allow for the sale of wine and beer on premise only (hereinafter “**Application**”) upon the real property located at 3216 SILVER AV SE (“**Subject Property**”). Below are the findings of facts:

FINDINGS:

1. Applicant is requesting a Conditional Use to allow for the sale of wine and beer on premise only.
2. The City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (1) (a) “SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS” reads in part: “*A conditional use shall be approved if and only if, in the circumstances of the particular case and under conditions imposed, the use proposed will not be injurious to the adjacent property, the neighborhood, or the community.*”
3. Applicant offered testimony at the Hearing that the Conditional Use, if approved, will not be injurious to the adjacent property, neighborhood, or the community because the request is for an existing restaurant that holds a conditional use permit for food sales. There have been no problems with or objections to the existing use, and the neighboring property which previously received a conditional use permit has been likewise free of potential injurious conditions. The neighborhood association (Nob Hill) supports the application. Procedures are in place to ensure responsible alcohol use.
4. The City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (1) (b) “SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS” reads in part: “*A conditional use shall be approved if and only if, in the circumstances of the particular case and under conditions imposed, the use proposed will not be significantly damaged by surrounding structures or activities.*”

5. Applicant offered testimony at the Hearing that the proposed conditional use, will not be significantly damaged by the surrounding structures or activities, which consist of the same type of use requested here and which appear fully compatible.
6. The yellow "Notice of Hearing" signs were posted for the required time period as articulated within City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances § 14-16-4-2 SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS.
7. The Applicant has adequately justified the Conditional Use request pursuant to City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances § 14-16-4-2 SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS.

DECISION:

APPROVAL of a CONDITIONAL USE to allow for the sale of wine and beer on premise only.

If you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so in the manner described below:

Appeal is to the Board of Appeals within 15 days of the decision. A filing fee of \$105.00 shall accompany each appeal application, as well as a written explanation outlining the reason for appeal and a copy of the ZHE decision. Appeals are taken at 600 2nd Street, Plaza Del Sol Building, Ground Level, Planning Application Counter located on the west side of the lobby. **Please present this letter of notification when filing an appeal.** When an application is withdrawn, the fee shall not be refunded.

An appeal shall be heard by the Board of Appeals within 45 days of the appeal period and concluded within 75 days of the appeal period. The Planning Division shall give written notice of an appeal, together with a notice of the date, time and place of the hearing to the applicant, a representative of the opponents, if any are known, and the appellant.

Please note that pursuant to Section 14. 16. 4. 4. (B), of the City of Albuquerque Comprehensive Zoning Code, you must demonstrate that you have legal standing to file an appeal as defined.

You will receive notice if any other person files an appeal. If there is no appeal, you can receive building permits any time after the appeal deadline quoted above, provided all conditions imposed at the time of approval have been met. However, the Zoning Hearing Examiner may allow issuance of building permits if the public hearing produces no objection of any kind to the approval of an application. To receive this approval, the applicant agrees in writing to return the building permit or occupation tax number.

Successful applicants are reminded that other regulations of the City must be complied with, even after approval of a special exception is secured. This decision does not constitute approval of plans for a building permit. If your application is approved, bring this decision with you when you apply for any

related building permit or occupation tax number. Approval of a conditional use or a variance application is void after one year from date of approval if the rights and privileges are granted, thereby have not been executed or utilized.
