TO: Interim (to be sworn in next week) APD Chief Banks

IAW the NM IPRA, request within the prescribed 15 days (August 12) the opportunity to review the lapel audio/video recordings, belt audio recordings and recordings made at the APD Area <u>Headquarters of the radio transmissions</u> made by the two officers involved in the recent killing of Vincent Wood-a Vietnam veteran with PTSD.

Also please indicate when the TASERs were issued to each officer and confirm that each of the two had one prior to the killing.

I just want to see and hear the recordings of the events <u>leading up to and the actual shooting</u> that the media said were made-<u>no edited versions please</u> and none that were made afterwards.

This is public information under the IPRA as you know. I am not interested in seeing the CAD or anything else.

Since you will be Chief next week within the required 15 day IPRA response time, this is being sent to you.

As you also know a lawsuit will be filed by the family against APD for what they feel is an unjustified killing. I am anxious to see whether this is true or not. Likely you know.

You are also aware that of the nine shots into Wood, some were into his back-unlike the version of the shooting Chief Schultz told the media during his press conference.

You also read today's Journal editorial that tells us some there are finally "getting it." See "<u>9 shots</u> puts judicious use of force in question" on Page A6 of July 27, 2013 issue of Albuquerque Journal

If you are indeed an "independent thinker" as some say you are, I'm sure you also "get it" and want both transparency and accountability in what your officers do-unlike Chief Schultz.

I assume this killing will also be considered by the POC in the near future.

Likely others as well as I wonder why the CPC against Officer Roberto wasn't sent to the POC before she was fired. I understand IRO investigator (former Belen police chief) Paul Scotchdopole who has come under a lot of criticism for his APD-biased investigations had investigated this alleged charge against Officer Roberto. Is this seemingly premature firing of Roberto of any concern to you?

PROOF - APD Covered Up Production of Videos of Shooting of James Boyd

On March 17th 2014 Albuquerque Police (APD) shot and killed a homeless and mentally ill man - whose only crime was a violation of a municipal ordinance against camping in an open space area in the Sandia foothills at the eastern edge of the city.

On March 17th, the day after the fatal shooting, KRQE made a public records request for the videos of that incident. On April 1st, APD unlawfully denied that request.

BUT ... Here is the REST of that Story.

To this day - not only have the Keith Sandy videos mysteriously disappeared - but when the APD finally produced videos claiming to be ALL the videos of the incident - many of the videos were missing INCLUDING almost all that actually show the SHOOTING - most NOTICEABLY - the very videos (from the other shooter - Dominique Perez) from which the now-famous shooting clip was taken and released by APD that week.

On April 2nd, one day after KRQE's request was unlawfully denied, an investigator with the APD interviewed Kevin Fuller, APD Video Unit Supervisor. According to the interview - included in this video - Fuller was instructed on FRIDAY March 21st - to obtain the videos and place them in a Drop Box account.

On Thursday, March 27th - he was instructed to coordinate with several other persons - and to look at all the videos, frame by frame, and identify those parts that the Chief might have an "interest" in BEFORE they were released to the media.

Although those videos have since been released (those that have) WITHOUT being identified by officer or time -Fuller and his team broke down each video by officer and began this work. He was, at this time, told to "take out" all videos in which the audio or video contained the actual shooting.

On Friday March 28th Fuller was instructed to place the videos on another hard drive and provide them to the FBI. BUT ... on Friday evening - Commander Montano on behalf of the Chief contacted Fuller and stated he had "concerns" allegedly about the Chain of Custody. He ordered Fuller to "cease and desist." He was later then told to give Montano the hard drive and to delete the videos from the drop box account.

It is unlawful for the APD to withhold, delay, or deny public records that have no exemption provided by law. The APD clearly DELAYED production in order to find those videos it might find embarrassing - or creating liability - with regard to the act of the shooting of Boyd. It then DENIED unlawfully the production of those videos.

Since then - it has produced videos it has CLAIMED were the complete set. BUT there are several known videos missing - not least being all the videos taken by the second shooter, Dominique Perez, from whose videos the famous clip released by APD initially came. Although several other officers' videos are MISSING from the set produced as well.

It is clear that the APD has and continues to knowingly and willfully withhold those videos. This interview contains proof, at minimum, that the APD had delayed production of the videos, contrary to the Public Records law, in order to try and identify those videos it considered problematic - this specifically was a reference to anything officers may have said to each other during the incident AND anything that revealed either audio or video of the actual shooting of Boyd.

PacSun Caves to Social Media Censorship Gangs, Stops Selling A\$AP Rocky Upside-Down Flag Shirts

What began with a customer of a Pacific Sunwear (PacSun) store expressing her displeasure on social media, over a t-shirt prominently displayed in the store, has culminated in the t-shirts removal from the company's website and stores. The t-shirt in question was from a collection designed by rapper A\$AP Rocky and features an upside down American flag. The upside down flag is the traditional sign of dire distress when there is extreme danger to life or property, but that some feel is disrespectful.

A\$AP Rocky has gone on record stating, "The reason that those flags are upside down are because our world is upside down. We're just trying to be understood," in an interview with Complex.

But others took the t-shirt as a blatant sign of disrespect. "I understand freedom of speech but this shirt, displayed prominently at the entrance of your store, for Memorial Day weekend is more distasteful and disrespectful than anything I thought I'd see," Rachel Zawacki-Kuss wrote on Facebook, a post that has since gone viral. "I will not be shopping at PacSun again." Of course not all customers felt that way, as one shopper we spoke with was none too pleased. After arriving at a PacSun Outlet store in Howell, Michigan, store patron Brandon LaVigne attempted to purchase one of the t-shirts in question and was rebuked by store employees.

According to LeVigne, he asked the employee, "So Pac Sun won't sell me a shirt that you have here, because someone else told you not to? It's nice you have regard for them. But what about regard for me, who drove all the way here and is standing in front of you with money in hand?"

And while a private business has a right to decide what merchandise it will stock its shelves with, it's a shame to see a company be pushed around by people blinded by nationalistic fervor and rabid patriotism. PacSun was quick to respond to the social media firestorm.

"As a retailer grounded in youth culture, PacSun values artistic and creative expression through the brands that we sell in our stores. Out of respect for those who have put their lives on the line for our country, we have decided to stop selling the licensed flag t-shirt and are removing it from our stores and website immediately," the company <u>posted on</u> <u>Facebook</u>. "We thank the men and women in uniform for their extraordinary service."

But military veteran Kristen Meghan gave some keen insights into the controversy in an article appearing on <u>TonyStiles.com</u>:

Every person in the U.S. Military takes an Oath to uphold and defend the Constitution, that oath did not mention a flag. I understand many Americans view the U.S. Flag as a symbol of liberty and freedom which is why it is confusing they are not outraged at the dangers affecting individual liberty and freedom. There are so many things occurring at home that disrespect "Liberty and Freedom." The logic that those who believe this country is in dire need of being resuscitated should somehow be met with threats of violence and met with online pitch forks is flawed. George Orwell once said, "Doublethink means the power of holding two contradictory beliefs in one's mind simultaneously, and accepting both of them".

Those people not afraid to hold a flag upside down, a signal of dire distress in instances of extreme danger to life or property are actually displaying the flag as a form nonviolent protest against all things that are a threat to the Constitution. There are many photos online of military personnel, in uniform, holding the flag upside down. Their call for help should not be viewed as disrespect or disgrace, quite the opposite. These veterans acknowledge imminent threats to life and liberty.

Although his t-shirt has been pulled, A\$AP Rock stands firm in his conviction that we are a nation in distress and that his shirt is simply a representation of a mental revolution

taking place across the U.S.

"We have upside-down American flags. We have camouflage and war gear and sh*t. All of it is a metaphor for what we're fighting for. We want to show them that we're all one generation and that things like discrimination shouldn't exist anymore," he told <u>Bro</u> <u>Bible</u>.

Thankfully for A\$AP Rocky the timing of the controversy couldn't be better, as he moved up his album release date, just yesterday releasing his highly anticipated sophomore album 'At.Long.Last.A\$AP.'

What is important for people to take away from the controversy surrounding this issue is that the upside down flag isn't flown as a means of disrespecting the flag, but rather as a sounding of the alarm meant to warn of mortal danger to the nation.

Do you think the upside down flag is a sign of disrespect or rather a clear warning of a nation in extreme distress?

Why is the US Flag displayed Upside Down?



The upside down U.S. flag is an official signal of distress. It is not meant to be, and is not officially recognized as any type of disrespect when so displayed for the right reasons. To the contrary, here is the relevant part of the US Code of Laws regarding how to fly the flag when in distress:

THE FLAG CODE Title 36, U.S.C., Chapter 10 As amended by P.L. 344, 94th Congress Approved July 7, 1976

§ 176. Respect for flag: No disrespect should be shown to the flag of the United States of America; the flag should not be dipped to any person or thing. Regimental colors, State flags, and organization or institutional flags are to be dipped as a mark of honor. (a) *The flag should never be displayed with the union down, except as a signal of dire distress in instances of extreme danger to life or property.* Most individuals who have served in the military service of our nation will (or should) recognize this signal. As a result of the many traitors and enemies we as a free people have, both foreign and domestic, as a result of the many unconstitutional acts, legislation and atrocities passed and/or committed against US citizens and their life, liberty and property, and as a result of policies that have allowed (and continue to allow) enemies of this nation to enter in large numbers through a porous border policy, I believe the life, liberty and property of US Citizens are in dire danger and distress.





- In cooperation with ACT, Public Service University launched an extensive study to validate the effectiveness and return on investment of the Work Keys[®] skills-based assessment system to the City of Albuquerque. PSU is the pilot program for such assessments, benefitting both the City and ACT.
- PSU the first Annual COA Education Fair on April 23, 2014. The goal was to bring the higher learning institutions to City employees in a comfortable and familiar environment in which employees could communicate with recruiters. 



AS you are aware "public records' means all documents, papers, letters, books, maps, tapes, photographs, recordings and other materials, regardless of physical form or characteristics, that are used, created, received, maintained or held by or on behalf of any public body and relate to public business, whether or not the records are required by law to be created or maintained." (14-2-6 NMSA 1978)

As you also know there has been no statutory exemption enacted that would pertain to these records. (14-2-1 NMSA 1978) You will also be further aware that according to the New Mexico Supreme Court "a citizen's right to know is the rule and secrecy is the exception."

Furthermore, as clearly and explicitly set forth in the "Purpose of the act; declaration of public policy" (14-2-4 NMSA 1978) the New Mexico Legislature established that their intent was to ensure, by declaring it public policy, that all persons are entitled to the "greatest possible information regarding the affairs of government and the official acts of public officers and employees."

The Legislature further unambiguously stated its intent and established as public policy that providing persons with such records "is an essential function of a representative government and an integral part of the routine duties of public officers and employees.(14-2-5 NMSA)

As the designated Public Records Custodian for the City you have an obligation to provide reasonable access to copies of such public records "during usual business hours." (14-2-8 NMSA).

And while, at maximum, the legislation provides a fifteen day period to provide records and a three day period upon receipt of the request to explain, in writing, when such records, if not provided prior to that date, the date when the request will be fulfilled - the clear intent of the Legislature is not to deem this maximum period as reasonable in all cases but only when necessary to fulfill the request.

Otherwise, the legislation requires records that are readily at hand and easily produced, to be provided without unnecessary delay - or in other words - "immediately or as soon as is practicable under the circumstances." (14-2-8(D) NMSA)

This requirement for timely production becomes even more important when a record is either or both of great public interest and needed in a timely manner.

The records requested, herein, are already available with nothing to cause a minimal delay beyond the time it takes to make an electronic copy. Thus this request is clearly neither "excessively burdensome" nor "over broad" in nature.

Furthermore, by their very nature, it is without question these are records both in their entirety and in any and every portion thereof that is a non-exempt record covered under this law.

In the event that you are unable to send the records I have requested via email, I am prepared to pay a reasonable cost for the duplication and CD or DVD for this request.

The law requires "the actual costs associated with downloading copies of public records to a computer disk or storage device, including the actual cost of the computer disk or storage device" alone be assessed for these records.

If that cost is to exceed the \$5 established by the City of Albuquerque's published policy for records fees that establishes that the cost for each CD or DVD is to be set at \$5 I request that you notify me immediately in writing (you can use the email listed herein for all communications to me pertaining to this request in order to ensure the most expedited process) as to the claimed cost and the legal basis upon which that fee has been established.

Although, clearly there are no statutory exemptions for this record if you intend to claim such and thus to withhold either the whole or any portion of the records please notify me in writing as to the explicit statutory exemption being claimed and relied upon.

Furthermore, if portions thereof are claimed exempt, please provide me those records that have no exemptions claimed prior to and at the first possible time and do not delay those portions until the other records, containing exemptions, are provided.

Given the public importance and interest in this record I request that you provide this record to me as soon as reasonably possible, within the legal time established by law or earlier if possible.

However, if you are unable to produce this record in that reasonable time frame please notify me in writing as to the reason for the delay and the date when the record will be made available.

Please contact me as soon as the records | have requested are ready.

AS you are aware "public records' means all documents, papers, letters, books, maps, tapes, photographs, recordings and other materials, regardless of physical form or characteristics, that are used, created, received, maintained or held by or on behalf of any public body and relate to public business, whether or not the records are required by law to be created or maintained." (14-2-6 NMSA 1978)

As you also know there has been no statutory exemption enacted that would pertain to these records. (14-2-1 NMSA 1978) You will also be further aware that according to the New Mexico Supreme Court "a citizen's right to know is the rule and secrecy is the exception."

Furthermore, as clearly and explicitly set forth in the "Purpose of the act; declaration of public policy" (14-2-4 NMSA 1978) the New Mexico Legislature established that

their intent was to ensure, by declaring it public policy, that all persons are entitled to the "greatest possible information regarding the affairs of government and the official acts of public officers and employees."

The Legislature further unambiguously stated its intent and established as public policy that providing persons with such records "is an essential function of a representative government and an integral part of the routine duties of public officers and employees.(14-2-5 NMSA)

As the designated Public Records Custodian for the City you have an obligation to provide reasonable access to copies of such public records "during usual business hours." (14-2-8 NMSA).

And while, at maximum, the legislation provides a fifteen day period to provide records and a three day period upon receipt of the request to explain, in writing, when such records, if not provided prior to that date, the date when the request will be fulfilled - the clear intent of the Legislature is not to deem this maximum period as reasonable in all cases but only when necessary to fulfill the request.

Otherwise, the legislation requires records that are readily at hand and easily produced, to be provided without unnecessary delay - or in other words - "immediately or as soon as is practicable under the circumstances." (14-2-8(D) NMSA)

This requirement for timely production becomes even more important when a record is either or both of great public interest and needed in a timely manner.

The records requested, herein, are already available with nothing to cause a minimal delay beyond the time it takes to make an electronic copy. Thus this request is clearly neither "excessively burdensome" nor "over broad" in nature.

Furthermore, by their very nature, it is without question these are records both in their entirety and in any and every portion thereof that is a non-exempt record covered under this law.

In the event that you are unable to send the records I have requested via email, I am prepared to pay a reasonable cost for the duplication and CD or DVD for this request.

The law requires "the actual costs associated with downloading copies of public records to a computer disk or storage device, including the actual cost of the computer disk or storage device" alone be assessed for these records.

If that cost is to exceed the \$5 established by the City of Albuquerque's published policy for records fees that establishes that the cost for each CD or DVD is to be set at \$5 I request that you notify me immediately in writing (you can use the email listed herein for all communications to me pertaining to this request in order to ensure the most expedited process) as to the claimed cost and the legal basis upon which that fee has been established.

Although, clearly there are no statutory exemptions for this record if you intend to claim such and thus to withhold either the whole or any portion of the records please notify me in writing as to the explicit statutory exemption being claimed and relied upon.

Furthermore, if portions thereof are claimed exempt, please provide me those records that have no exemptions claimed prior to and at the first possible time and do not delay those portions until the other records, containing exemptions, are provided.

Given the public importance and interest in this record I request that you provide this record to me as soon as reasonably possible, within the legal time established by law or earlier if possible.

However, if you are unable to produce this record in that reasonable time frame please notify me in writing as to the reason for the delay and the date when the record will be made available.

Please contact me as soon as the records I have requested are ready.

Subject: Settlement Agreement, DOJ, Preventing Retaliation – Paragraph 196.

On May 5, 2015 at 1300 hours, Civilian Police Oversight Agency (CPOA) Acting Executive Director Robin Hammer and I reviewed Albuquerque Police Department's current anti-retaliation policies and implementation, as mandated in the Department of Justice (DOJ) Settlement Agreement Paragraph 196. Settlement Agreement Paragraph 196 is found in the <u>Section VIII. Misconduct Complaint Intake</u>. Investigation and Adjudication. DOJ paragraph 196 states:

196. Within six months of the Effective Date, and annually thereafter, the Internal Affairs Bureau and the Civilian Police Oversight Agency shall review APD's anti-retaliation policy and its implementation. This review shall consider the alleged incidents of retaliation that occurred or were investigated during the reporting period, the discipline imposed for retaliation, and supervisors' performance in addressing and preventing retaliation. Following such review, the City shall modify its policy and practice, as necessary, to protect individuals, including other APD personnel, from retaliation for reporting misconduct.

Paragraph 196, addresses a review of APD's retaliation policies for reporting misconduct. The Albuquerque Police Department current Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) prohibit retaliation in two sections. The Department prohibits retaliation through Personnel Code of Conduct Rule1-04-4(N) which states:

Rule1-04-4(N). Personnel will not act officiously or permit personal feelings, animosities, or friendship to influence their decisions.

Another current anti-retaliation policy, which has a level five sanction, is also outlined in Personnel Code of Conduct Rule 1-04-6(1).

Rule: 1-04-6(I) states:

Personnel shall not knowingly interfere with criminal or administrative investigations, assigned tasks, or duty assignments of another, and shall not directly or indirectly, by threat

or bribe, attempt to secure the withdrawal or abandonment of a complaint or charges. Personnel shall not, without previous authorization from the primary investigator or immediate supervisor, conduct any criminal or administrative follow-up investigation outside the scope of their assignment.

After conferring, CPOA Acting Executive Director Hammer and I agreed that SOP Rule 1-04-6(I) should be amended to specifically address retaliation for the filing an administrative or criminal complaint or allegation. On March 16, 2015, the Professional Accountability Division proposed to the Standard Operating Procedure Review Committee (SOPRC) that the additional language be included to 1-04-6(I):

Retaliation for reporting misconduct or for cooperating with an investigation of misconduct shall be grounds for discipline, up to and including termination of employment. (DOJ ¶197 ¶195)

The SOPRC is currently reviewing this proposed additional language for SOP Rule I-04-6(I) to specifically address retaliation for making an allegation against an APD employee.

Also at our meeting on May 5, 2015, Acting Executive Director Hammer and I conducted an audit on all Internal Affairs and Civilian Police Complaints cases decided from 2007 to present which included allegations of violations of SOP Rules 1-04-6(N) and 1-04-6(I).

Upon audit of cases alleging violations of SOP Rule 1-04-6(N), revealed 128 cases. Of these 128, six (6) were found to contain allegations of retaliation, five (5) Citizen Complaints and one (1) Internal Affairs case. Upon review, the five (5) Citizen Complaints, did not relate to "retaliation" as described in DOJ paragraph 196, but rather there was an allegation that police action was in retaliation for the citizens' prior actions or feelings. These five complaints claimed acts of "retaliation" as a result of police action, e.g. subject receiving a citation, and not as a result of a citizen initially complaining on an officer or employee.

One Internal Affairs case, I-131-07, involved an allegation for retaliation for making an administrative or criminal complaint. In this case, an APD employee was found to be violation of 1-04-4(N) for retaliation for another employee making an administrative complaint. The employee was sustained on SOP 1-04-4(N). The Chief imposed discipline in that case resulting in the demotion of the employee.

Twenty-two (22) cases were reviewed during an audit of all cases containing allegations of violations of SOP Rule 1-04-6(I). None of these cases related to "retaliation" for making a criminal or administrative complaint as described in Paragraph 196.

Acting Executive Director Robin Hammer fully participated in and endorsed the review of the described Internal and Civilian complaints. Acting Executive Director Hammer also will provide a copy of this Memo to the full Police Oversight Board for their consideration. As described by the DOJ mandate, we agreed to schedule an annual meeting between, as the Commander of the

Professional Accountability Division, and Ms. Hammer as the CPOA Executive Director, to review APD's retaliation Policies and implementation. Our next review is currently set for May 5, 2016.

1-04 PERSONNEL CODE OF CONDUCT

POLICY:

Personnel of the Albuquerque Police Department are expected to follow a prescribed code of conduct and to act responsibly while on and off-duty. The Department holds its personnel accountable for all actions which reflect adversely on the department.

RULES:

- 1-04-1 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS
- [5] A. Personnel shall obey all laws, rules and regulations, and to the best of their abilities, protect the rights of the people as provided in the Constitution of the United States.
- [1] B. Personnel shall obey all felony criminal laws of the United States of America, and of any state and local jurisdiction in which they are present.
- [1 5] C. After notice to the employee and an opportunity for a hearing, the department may impose discipline, up to and including termination, upon the occurrence of either of the following:
 - completion of a criminal investigation or internal investigation which, by a preponderance of the evidence, establishes there is probable cause to believe the employee has violated a felony and/or misdemeanor law.
 - OR
 - 2) Indictment, criminal information, or other formal criminal charge for the violation of any felony or misdemeanor law, which shall be deemed prima facie evidence of a violation of the felony and/or misdemeanor law.
- [4] D. Personnel shall obey all municipal, county, state, federal civil laws, including, but not limited to Protective Orders (i.e., Restraining Orders) which may be filed against them, or filed by the employee against another person. The employee will immediately provide a copy of any Protective Order, which affects him or her, to the appropriate deputy chief/deputy director/area commander through the chain of command.
 - E. Personnel shall not commit or omit any acts which constitute a violation of any of the rules, regulations, directives, or orders of the department.

The long distance phone log will be compared to the charges on the long distance phone bill to detect any discrepancies. If any discrepancies are found, they will be investigated by the command.

1-04-11 EMPLOYEE NEPOTISM AND FRATERNIZATION POLICY

PURPOSE:

The purpose for this directive is to establish department policy on personal relationships between department employees which give rise to an actual or perceived potential conflict of interest with professional responsibilities and/or which create the potential for an adverse impact on department operations, safety, efficiency and morale.

As an organization that is heavily dependent upon its human resources, the department has a vital interest in the maintenance of harmonious, efficient, and productive working relationships between its employees. Personal relationships that cause unrest, lend themselves to the perception of favoritism, adversely affect morale, or otherwise disrupt the good working order of the department are undesirable.

POLICY:

The department believes that the most qualified candidates will be selected for positions in the department, for promotions and for assignment to specialized positions. Employees who are related to or who are engaged in a romantic relationship with candidates for hiring selection, promotion or assignment to specialized positions must ensure that all reasonable precautions are taken to avert any undue influence in the selection process or even the appearance of impropriety in the process. It further recognizes the rights of employees to become involved in personal relationships with their co-workers. However, it is the policy of the Albuquerque Police Department to ensure that its employees carry out their duties with impartiality and fairness so that public and organizational confidence in the actions of our employees is maintained.

Public trust, workplace safety, agency operations and department morale require that employees avoid the appearance of or actual conflict of interest between their professional responsibilities and any involvement in a romantic or sexual relationship with other employees. In order to promote efficient operation of the department and avoid misunderstandings, complaints of favoritism, sexual harassment and/or gender based discrimination, and other problems of supervision, safety, department operations, and employee morale, all employees are instructed to avoid situations that give rise to an actual or perceived conflict.

DEFINITIONS:

A. Family relationship: A relationship resulting from family ancestry or marriage. For this policy this includes spouse, parent (including foster, step, and in-law); children (including adoptive, foster, or step); brother or sister; grandparent or grandchild; aunt or uncle; niece or nephew; or any other relative living in the same household as the employee or another individual related by blood, marriage, or quasi-marriage in the same household as a departmental employee. Relative includes a significant other or domestic partner.

- 2. If a supervisor and a subordinate marry or cohabitate, the Deputy Chief of Police/Civilian Manager will review the working relationship of the two employees and determine if it creates a potential conflict of interest or an adverse impact on supervision, safety, operations or morale. The Deputy Chief of Police/Civilian Manager will make reasonable efforts to transfer, reassign, or otherwise resolve the situation so that one of the employees is placed in a position where the conflict potential no longer exists. Prior to any reassignment, the department will receive input from the involved employees.
- 3. The Deputy Chief of Police/Civilian Manager shall take appropriate steps to ensure that involved employees' working conditions are modified to eliminate potential conflicts of interest and adverse workplace performance problems.
- 4. The Deputy Chief of Police/Civilian Manager shall prepare a written report regarding the situation and his/her resolutions. This report shall be transmitted to the Chief of Police and Human Resources Director.
- [5-7] C. Failure by an employee to report nepotism and/or fraternization to the Deputy Chief of Police/Civilian Manager compromises the integrity of the Department's chain of command, disrupts the work environment, causes decline in morale and can reduce productivity. Any failure to report nepotism and/or fraternization as required by this policy shall constitute misconduct and may subject an employee to disciplinary action.

DOJ SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Paragraph 196

Within six months of the Effective Date, and annually thereafter, the Internal Affairs Bureau and the Civilian Police Oversight Agency shall review APD's anti-retaliation policy and its implementation. This review shall consider the alleged incidents of retaliation that occurred or were investigated during the reporting period, the discipline imposed for retaliation, and supervisors' performance in addressing and preventing retaliation. Following such review, the City shall modify its policy and practice, as necessary, to protect individuals, including other APD personnel, from retaliation for reporting misconduct.

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CIVILIAN POLICE OVERSIGHT AGENCY DIRECTOR

Job descriptions are intended to present a general list of tasks/duties performed by employees within this job classification. Job Descriptions are <u>not</u> intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Under the direction and supervision of the Police Oversight Board (POB), the Director supervises and directs the operations of the Civilian Police Oversight Agency (CPOA). The Director oversees, monitors, and reviews all citizen police complaints or complements, serious uses of force including officer-involved shooting cases, and claims directed against officers and employees of the Albuquerque Police Department (APD). The Director will act as lead investigator and supervise the investigative and administrative staff of the CPOA; as well as assigning citizen police complaints to CPOA staff for investigation. The Director will provide recommendations and advice regarding Departmental policies and procedures to the POB; the Director will also provide advice, as appropriate, to the APD, the City Council, and the Mayor. The Director is responsible for the performance of the CPOA staff's duties in line with policy, guidance, and city ordinance.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED:

Receives direction from, reports directly to, and is responsible to, and is evaluated by the Police Oversight Board (POB).

Exercises direct supervision over the investigative and administrative staff of the Civilian Police Oversight Agency, and manages the agency, in accordance with the Police Oversight Ordinance; is primarily responsible for all investigations and work product of the CPOA Agency and Agency staff.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Essential functions may include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Oversees, reviews, and investigates all citizen police complaints against the officers and employees of the APD and delegates work as necessary to CPOA staff.
- 2. Analyzes citizen police complaints and assigns complaints for investigation by CPOA staff in accordance with policy, guidance, and city ordinance.
- 3. Monitors and conducts supervisory oversight of all of the investigations above, makes thorough and objective findings or disposition for each complaint, and reports these findings or other disposition of these citizen police complaints to the POB.
- 4. May refer cases to impartial mediation or other alternative dispute resolution as appropriate.
- 5. Provides recommendations and advises the APD, the City Council, and the Mayor in police department policies and procedures, as directed by the POB.
- 6. Monitors all claims of excessive force and lawsuits against the APD, acting as an ex-officio member of the Claims Review Board.
- 7. Reviews and reports on the investigations on all officer involved shootings to the POB as well as to the Chief of Police and other appropriate parties. Is available for response to officer involved shootings, or other incidents as appropriate.
- 8. Compiles data for the analysis of applicable areas of concern within citizen complaints. Coordinates with CPOA staff to provide recommendations, analysis, and comment to the POB from collected data.
- 9. Collects and compiles information so as to satisfy all reporting requirements under the Oversight Ordinance for the POB.
- 10. Participates in budget preparation, attends related meetings, monitors expenditures, recommends budgetary adjustments, and makes quarterly budget reports to the POB.

- 11. Plays an active role in providing pro-active outreach to the community regarding police oversight. Responsible for the development of an outreach plan with the goals to educate the public and publicize the citizen complaint process.
- 12. Develops recommendations to the POB regarding the APD on specific training, changes in policy, or standard operating procedures (SOPs).
- 13. Provides staff support and technical assistance to the POB. Ensures the appropriate support for the POB, its subcommittees, and meetings.
- 14. Oversees the creation and maintenance of a public website for the posting of POB-related material, to include social medial presence in coordination with the POB's Community Engagement Subcommittee and the Community Outreach Coordinator.
- 15. Works collaboratively with the POB, the APD, the community and other stakeholders in order to facilitate communication between the POB, APD, the community and other groups.
- 16. Promote a spirit of accountability and communication between citizens and the APD, while working to improve community-police relations.

SUPPLEMENTAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Attends and participates in professional group meetings related to police oversight; stays abreast of new trends and innovations in the field of police oversight, police professionalism and police-community relations.
- 2. Performs other related duties and responsibilities as required or requested by the POB.

MINIMUM EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

Whether an applicant is qualified for the position of Director shall be determined by the POB. However, the minimal qualifications shall include the following:

- 1. Must possess a professional law degree (J.D. or LL.B) from an ABA accredited law school.
- 2. Must be active members in good standing of the bar of any US state or territory, or the District of Columbia.
- 3. Experienced in criminal investigations.
- 4. Knowledge of administrative and judicial processes, policies, and procedures.
- 5. Knowledge of employment contract interpretation.
- 6. Proven track record of effective management experience.

All applicants must meet all minimum qualifications requirements described in this announcement by the closing date.

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

I believe you are in violation of IPRA. Below are the specific IPRA references that should apply:

B. PROCEDURE FOR DENYING REQUESTS

For requests to inspect that are denied, the custodian must mail or deliver a notice to the requester within 15 days of receiving the request. Office of the Attorney General State of New Mexico 40

(See Appendix II, Form V.) The denial notice must be in writing, describe the records sought to be inspected, set forth the names and titles or positions of each person responsible for the denial, and explain the reason for the denial. The reason provided in the denial notice must be authorized by the Act, another law, court rule, or the U.S. or state constitution, as discussed in Chapter III, Section B.10.

Example 62:

A reporter submits a written request to a city police department to inspect the records kept by the officer investigating a recent murder. Three days after receiving the request, the records custodian for the department mails the reporter a notice stating that the records are available for inspection immediately, with the following exceptions: records revealing confidential sources, methods, information or individuals accused but not charged with a crime. The notice also sets forth the names and positions of the custodian and the police officer as the persons responsible for the denial and cites Section 14-2-1(A)(4) of the Act, which protects law enforcement records, as the reason for the denial. This notice complies with the Act.

C. DAMAGES FOR FAILURE TO PROVIDE A WRITTEN DENIAL

If a custodian does not deliver or mail a written explanation of denial within 15 days of receiving a request to inspect, an action to enforce the Act may be brought and damages awarded to the requester. Damages are not recoverable if the failure to provide a timely explanation of denial is shown to be reasonable. If unreasonable, a custodian's failure to provide the required explanation may result in damages of up to \$100 per day until the written explanation is provided. The Act does not make the custodian personally responsible for payment of any damages awarded, but provides for payment from the funds of the public body. Example 63:

The records custodian for an agency goes on vacation for three weeks. On the first day of her vacation, the office receives a request to inspect certain records that the agency maintains. The request is placed in the absent custodian's "in box." On the day she returns from vacation (21 days after the inspection request was received), the custodian finds the request, determines the request should be denied and immediately mails a written explanation to the requester. The requester files an action in district court because the explanation was not mailed in a timely fashion. If the court determines that the reason for the delay was not reasonable, it could award damages of up to \$600 (\$100 per day for day 16 through day 21).

This will include all government operated email and all private email accounts where CPOA/POB/Acting Executive Director's Office business is discussed. Note: Any and all redactions to these documents will require, as spelled out in the New Mexico Inspection of Public Records Act, full explanations.

2. The CPOA policy, where it is derived from and how it complies with the New Mexico Open Meetings Act, that allows the POB Subcommittee meeting's agendas, dates, times, and locations to not be published/notified to the public 72 hours in advance in accordance with the New Mexico Open Meetings Act.

3. The CPOA/POB policy, where it is derived from and how it complies with the New Mexico Open Meetings Act, that allows the POB to go into closed session to discuss the POB's selection process/policies concerning personnel that have, as or more importantly, not yet been named, selected or hired as CPOA/POB/Executive Director Office or as City Employees.

3(a). All documents that show how and where the "civilians", that the CPOA represents, have access to or input into this process and how it complies with City Ordinance 9-4-1-4(C2) where it states in part; The CPOA shall promote a spirit of accountability while improving community relations and enhancing public confidence.

4. The CPOA/POB policy, where it is derived from and how it complies with the New Mexico Open Meetings Act, that allows less then a quorum of POB members to congregate in closed door meetings where conclusions from those meetings are then used to advise/direct decisions then voted on by the POB as a quorum in open public session.
