Under the the New Mexico Inspection of Public Records Act (IPRA) Mr. Davidson's email and all attachments are a public record.

This question has been already been adjudicated in the New Mexico Court of Appeals in Cox vs NM Dept of Public Safety 2010-NMCA-096, 148 N.M. 934, cert, quashed 150 N.M. 765 where the New Mexico Court of Appeals specifically found that a complaint against a public employee is a public record and does not fall under any exemptions as it being "a personnel matter" in any of the subsections of section 14-2-1(B) of the Inspection of Public Records Act.

As I told you yesterday, when you hemmed and hawed as to giving me these records, you are already in violation of my original request dated April 11th 2015 (you received on the 13th from Robin Hammer) where you made no claims to any exceptions or need for additional time, beyond the allowed 15 days, to respond.

If I do not receive these documents today, via email, as I have no intention of driving across town to your office for a 4th time and paying for them, you and city legal will force me to file a complaint with the New Mexico State Attorney General's office for your and city legal's violations of the Inspection of Public Records Act.



Reference my May 13, 2015 e-mail, subject "*ABQ Free Press: APD stalks, harasses us, cop critics claim. (No consequences for questionable APD behavior) and the still police state here. You need to come*" and earlier e-mails sent Bcc to you

In my May 13 e-mail, I provided you examples of the Mayor's blessed retaliation by our corrupt police leadership against me and other citizens and even DA Brandenburg. See the recent excellent KRQE report by our State AG damning Chief Eden below for the secret investigation on the DA to intimidate her.

She justifiably fears for her safety after seeing noted civil rights attorney Mary Han a perceived enemy of APD murdered at her home where APD contaminated the crime scene and even searched her home looking for incriminating information on APD and city leaders. Even honest APD police officers are retaliated against. Sam Costales was just one I cited to you.

See the attached memo by the APD union leadership (APOA VP Willoughby) damning any honest cop who dares reveal corruption within APD.

For the first time videos and audio recordings were (likely inadvertently) released to Ms. Brandenburg showing the unjustified killing of homeless camper James Boyd in the foothills in March 2014. As the attached Live Leak posting reveals, some recordings and other incriminating information of the Boyd killing were withheld/destroyed by APD.

Now, DA Brandenburg did not have to rely on the lies told by APD officers and their complicit police accomplices to conceal their excessive use of force including this unjustified killing. Over 40 APD and other police officers were at the scene of the Boyd killing for over four hours and only one video and one audio recording was released/leaked.. APD Chief Eden and all of his senior staff conveniently stayed away.

Two officers killed/murdered the non-threatening Boyd who had only drawn two small knives merely to protect himself from being torn to bits by a fierce APD K-9 dog who was straining at the leash to get to him.

Because it was getting dark and all of the 40+ apparently wanted to go home to their families the two decided to gun Boyd down. The dog was finally turned loose on his lifeless fallen body and began chewing on it.

One of Eden's first acts as APD Chief was to claim this murder was justified and likely then with the Mayor's blessing do the secret investigation on DA Brandenburg to scare her into not charging the two APD killers. Now 14 months later the two have still not been brought to trial.

If we had a mayor of color here like the excellent Baltimore African-American mayor rather than one who surrounds himself with others in his handpicked white aristocracy here, those victims of color, the homeless and veterans and others wouldn't be brutalized and murdered here.

While the New Mexico AG's blame in the article below is focused on Chief Eden, responsibility for the secret investigation released only to the Mayor's controlled daily newspaper here rests fully on our mayor.

As the attached 3-16 Eye on Albuquerque.com blog posting says-Berry runs the City like a gangster. Police officers here and elsewhere in the US are expected to be viewed by citizens as deities/gods merely for putting on the uniform and are compared to our combat troops who are the only ones who put their lives on the line every day.

The many good cops in APD I spoke to hate their leadership beginning with those in the Mayor's office. Recently a young APD cadet bravely exposed the beating by an officer of a citizen on March 20 to his superiors but this was kept a secret from the public for six weeks until it was leaked to the media. This cadet was an example of a true hero-one who should be recognized as such by the city Council-since our Mayor and his Chief won't do so.

After some outstanding investigative work by Luis Saucedo and Jocelyn Samuels (who has unfortunately left the DOJ) we citizens expected a reform agreement with some teeth in it and one that would address all of the real problems here that go far beyond merely more APD training. We also expected an independent monitor who had the power to do more than suggest changes. We got neither.

The monitor James Ginger chosen by the federal judge and your people and other members of his PMR Inc. team are all former police officers who now want to be paid over \$4.5 million of our tax dollars for the next four years to do nothing but suggest changes.

They believe that they work only for the DOJ, the federal judge and Mayor and not our elected legislative representatives-our city Councilors who were left out of the negotiation process-as was APD Chief Eden.

The agreement is a sham because your US Attorney Damon Martinez and others succumbed to the threats of a long and costly lawsuit by the city and agreed to a sham agreement that omitted many of the reform recommendations submitted by we-the people including the ones in the "Amicus Curiae" brief submitted by APD Forward that federal judge Brack ignored. The first page of this

Amicus Curiae is attached.

This police state is here also promoted by our equally arrogant Bernalillo County Sheriff who still refuses to equip his deputies with video recorders and continues to seize citizens cell phones in order to destroy evidence of unjustified killings-one his deputies did recently. No recordings-no charges. BCSO Sheriff Gonzales also refuses to endorse a citizen police oversight process with his police union's blessing . It's arrogance at its worst and something you should also look into.


Please, please come here and help the good people here clean up the disgraceful situation here to include demanding a revision to the current disgraceful agreement and possible selection of a new monitor.

AG won't charge Brandenburg in bribery case

Detective: Case against Brandenburg is 'weak,' 'but it's gonna destroy a career' DA Brandenburg denies bribery, intimidation allegations

ALBUQUERQUE (KRQE) — Bernalillo County District Attorney Kari Brandenburg will not face charges for allegedly trying to bribe and intimidate victims of burglaries committed by her adult son. New Mexico Attorney General Hector Balderas made the announcement this morning in a news release, saying the Albuquerque Police Department's case and his own investigation produced "insufficient evidence" of a crime. "While we did not find sufficient evidence of criminal conduct, there were identifiable leadership failures to which both agencies can take immediate corrective action and begin to re-focus on serving the people of Albuquerque and Bernalillo County," said Balderas in a prepared statement. Balderas also sent a letter to APD Chief Gorden Eden criticizing the department's investigation as well as Brandenburg's contact with potential witnesses and alleged victims.

The attorney general wrote that a lengthy delay between the apparent conclusion of APD's investigation and the department's decision to charge the case "was initially a conscious decision" that his investigation concluded was "based solely on political motivation." Balderas had harsh words for Eden about the department's decision to release the massive case file to the media before the Attorney General's Office had time to review it or make certain the proper personal information was redacted. The word-for-word accounts of witness interviews contained in file potentially polluted the recollection of other witnesses in the case, Balderas said, and soured any additional investigation his office would need. In fact, Balderas raised serious questions about the department's motivation for releasing the case file and announcing its previously secret investigation.

Balderas said his investigators determined APD moved the case forward shortly after Brandenburg let lawyers for APD officers Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez know that she would likely charge them with open counts of murder in the shooting of homeless camper James Boyd in March 2014. The attorney general criticized Brandenburg's conduct as well. Balderas wrote, "her lack of disclosure and actions of personally engaging..clearly created an appearance of impropriety." The AG said Brandenburg should have asked for a special prosecutor and let APD know that she had become aware of the investigation and made prosecutorial arrangements should the department decide to charge her son. The police investigation has been at the center of a building storm in the once-placid relationship between Brandenburg's office and APD.

Throughout much of early 2014, APD detective David Nix interviewed victims of burglaries by Justin Koch, Brandenburg's adult son. The victims said Koch had stolen jewelry, electronics and a gun from them. Nix believed Brandenburg had approached the victims and reimbursed — or offered to reimburse — them for what had been stolen in an effort to keep them from proceeding with criminal charges against Koch. Brandenburg did have contact with the victims who said her son stole from them. But in reams of emails and Facebook messages reviewed by KRQE News 13, the four-term DA never appeared to offer a bribe or a quid pro quo, as APD later alleged.

Police appear to have based their belief on an interview with one of the alleged burglary victims. In an unusual move, detectives interviewed that man in the presence of his girlfriend.

"I am absolutely clear that I did nothing wrong," Brandenburg said when news of the case came to light. By the end of July 2014, Nix had apparently finished his investigation. It wasn't much of a case

— “weak” according to a conversation between Nix and detective Soren Ericksen — and the file sat, uncharged, at APD for months. The case had other problems, too, according to law enforcement experts who spoke with News 13 last year.

In early October 2014, representatives from Brandenburg’s office met with the lawyer for the Albuquerque Police Officers Association to advise him that criminal charges would likely be coming against APD officers Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez for shooting and killing homeless camper James Boyd in the Albuquerque foothills earlier that year. That information made its way to APD. Within weeks, Albuquerque police had finished the once-dormant investigation into Brandenburg. The department took the unusual step of hand-delivering their completed investigation — unannounced — to the Attorney General’s Office. It was dropped off, former General Counsel Dave Pederson said at the time, in a “big, sealed box” at the security desk and addressed to the wrong person at the AG’s Office.

The case arrived during the closing months of Gary King’s term in office and after Balderas won election in November. Balderas knew the decision whether to charge Brandenburg would likely be waiting when he walked in the door in January. It was while Balderas and his staff attorneys were reviewing the case, Brandenburg filed open counts of murder against Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez through criminal information. As the case moved toward a preliminary hearing in which a judge would decide whether there was enough evidence against the officers to warrant a trial, their attorneys successfully disqualified Brandenburg from the case after convincing state District Court Judge Alisa Hadfield that the perception of a conflict of interest could be enough to sap the public’s faith in the way the case would be handled by the judicial system. The APD case which Balderas declined to charge today formed the backbone of that perceived conflict of interest.

PROOF - APD Covered Up Production of Videos of Shooting of James Boyd

On March 17th 2014 Albuquerque Police (APD) shot and killed a homeless and mentally ill man - whose only crime was a violation of a municipal ordinance against camping in an open space area in the Sandia foothills at the eastern edge of the city.

On March 17th, the day after the fatal shooting, KRQE made a public records request for the videos of that incident. On April 1st, APD unlawfully denied that request.

BUT ... Here is the REST of that Story.

To this day - not only have the Keith Sandy videos mysteriously disappeared - but when the APD finally produced videos claiming to be ALL the videos of the incident - many of the videos were missing INCLUDING almost all that actually show the SHOOTING - most NOTICEABLY - the very videos (from the other shooter - Dominique Perez) from which the now-famous shooting clip was taken and released by APD that week.

On April 2nd, one day after KRQE's request was unlawfully denied, an investigator with the APD interviewed Kevin Fuller, APD Video Unit Supervisor. According to the interview - included in this video - Fuller was instructed on FRIDAY March 21st - to obtain the videos and place them in a Drop Box account.

On Thursday, March 27th - he was instructed to coordinate with several other persons - and to look at all the videos, frame by frame, and identify those parts that the Chief might have an "interest" in BEFORE they were released to the media.

Although those videos have since been released (those that have) WITHOUT being identified by officer or time - Fuller and his team broke down each video by officer and began this work. He was, at this time, told to "take out" all videos in which the audio or video contained the actual shooting.

On Friday March 28th Fuller was instructed to place the videos on another hard drive and provide them to the FBI. BUT ... on Friday evening - Commander Montano on behalf of the Chief contacted Fuller and stated he had "concerns" allegedly about the Chain of Custody. He ordered Fuller to "cease and desist." He was later then told to give Montano the hard drive and to delete the videos from the drop box account.

It is unlawful for the APD to withhold, delay, or deny public records that have no exemption provided by law. The APD clearly DELAYED production in order to find those videos it might find embarrassing - or creating liability - with regard to the act of the shooting of Boyd. It then DENIED unlawfully the production of those videos.

Since then - it has produced videos it has CLAIMED were the complete set. BUT there are several known videos missing - not least being all the videos taken by the second shooter, Dominique Perez, from whose videos the famous clip released by APD initially came. Although several other officers' videos are MISSING from the set produced as well.

It is clear that the APD has and continues to knowingly and willfully withhold those videos. This interview contains proof, at minimum, that the APD had delayed production of the videos, contrary to the Public Records law, in order to try and identify those videos it considered problematic - this specifically was a reference to anything officers may have said to each other during the incident AND anything that revealed either audio or video of the actual shooting of Boyd.



AG won't charge Brandenburg in bribery case

Detective: Case against Brandenburg is 'weak,' 'but it's gonna destroy a career' DA Brandenburg denies bribery, intimidation allegations

ALBUQUERQUE (KRQE) — Bernalillo County District Attorney Kari Brandenburg will not face charges for allegedly trying to bribe and intimidate victims of burglaries committed by her adult son. New Mexico Attorney General Hector Balderas made the announcement this morning in a news release, saying the Albuquerque Police Department's case and his own investigation produced "insufficient evidence" of a crime. "While we did not find sufficient evidence of criminal conduct, there were identifiable leadership failures to which both agencies can take immediate corrective action and begin to re-focus on serving the people of Albuquerque and Bernalillo County," said Balderas in a prepared statement. Balderas also sent a letter to APD Chief Gorden Eden criticizing the department's investigation as well as Brandenburg's contact with potential witnesses and alleged victims.

The attorney general wrote that a lengthy delay between the apparent conclusion of APD's investigation and the department's decision to charge the case "was initially a conscious decision" that his investigation concluded was "based solely on political motivation." Balderas had harsh words for Eden about the department's decision to release the massive case file to the media before the Attorney General's Office had time to review it or make certain the proper personal information was redacted. The word-for-word accounts of witness interviews contained in file potentially

polluted the recollection of other witnesses in the case, Balderas said, and soured any additional investigation his office would need. In fact, Balderas raised serious questions about the department's motivation for releasing the case file and announcing its previously secret investigation.

Balderas said his investigators determined APD moved the case forward shortly after Brandenburg let lawyers for APD officers Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez know that she would likely charge them with open counts of murder in the shooting of homeless camper James Boyd in March 2014. The attorney general criticized Brandenburg's conduct as well. Balderas wrote, "her lack of disclosure and actions of personally engaging... clearly created an appearance of impropriety." The AG said Brandenburg should have asked for a special prosecutor and let APD know that she had become aware of the investigation and made prosecutorial arrangements should the department decide to charge her son. The police investigation has been at the center of a building storm in the once-placid relationship between Brandenburg's office and APD.

Throughout much of early 2014, APD detective David Nix interviewed victims of burglaries by Justin Koch, Brandenburg's adult son. The victims said Koch had stolen jewelry, electronics and a gun from them. Nix believed Brandenburg had approached the victims and reimbursed — or offered to reimburse — them for what had been stolen in an effort to keep them from proceeding with criminal charges against Koch. Brandenburg did have contact with the victims who said her son stole from them. But in reams of emails and Facebook messages reviewed by KROE News 13, the four-term DA never appeared to offer a bribe or a quid pro quo, as APD later alleged.

Police appear to have based their belief on an interview with one of the alleged burglary victims. In an unusual move, detectives interviewed that man in the presence of his girlfriend.

"I am absolutely clear that I did nothing wrong," Brandenburg said when news of the case came to light. By the end of July 2014, Nix had apparently finished his investigation. It wasn't much of a case — "weak" according to a conversation between Nix and detective Soren Ericksen — and the file sat, uncharged, at APD for months. The case had other problems, too, according to law enforcement experts who spoke with News 13 last year.

In early October 2014, representatives from Brandenburg's office met with the lawyer for the Albuquerque Police Officers Association to advise him that criminal charges would likely be coming against APD officers Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez for shooting and killing homeless camper James Boyd in the Albuquerque foothills earlier that year. That information made its way to APD. Within weeks, Albuquerque police had finished the once-dormant investigation into Brandenburg. The department took the unusual step of hand-delivering their completed investigation — unannounced — to the Attorney General's Office. It was dropped off, former General Counsel Dave Pederson said at the time, in a "big, sealed box" at the security desk and addressed to the wrong person at the AG's Office.

The case arrived during the closing months of Gary King's term in office and after Balderas won election in November. Balderas knew the decision whether to charge Brandenburg would likely be waiting when he walked in the door in January. It was while Balderas and his staff attorneys were reviewing the case, Brandenburg filed open counts of murder against Keith Sandy and Dominique Perez through criminal information. As the case moved toward a preliminary hearing in which a

judge would decide whether there was enough evidence against the officers to warrant a trial, their attorneys successfully disqualified Brandenburg from the case after convincing state District Court Judge Alisa Hadfield that the perception of a conflict of interest could be enough to sap the public's faith in the way the case would be handled by the judicial system. The APD case which Balderas declined to charge today formed the backbone of that perceived conflict of interest.

PROOF - APD Covered Up Production of Videos of Shooting of James Boyd

This interview contains proof, at minimum, that the APD had delayed production of the videos, contrary to the Public Records law, in order to try and identify those videos it considered problematic - this specifically was a reference to anything officers may have said to each other during the incident AND anything that revealed either audio or video of the actual shooting of Boyd.

Dear Mr. Dell'Angela:

This is in response to your May 20, 2014 Freedom of Information Act request, received by the Civil Rights Division on May 21, 2014, seeking the "opportunity to review concurrently drafts of the consent decree or other directive document to APD specifying the expected reforms."

The records you have requested pertain to an ongoing law enforcement proceeding. After consideration of the responsive records, I have determined that access to the documents should be denied pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(7)(A), since disclosure thereof could reasonably be expected to interfere with law enforcement proceedings. I have further determined that certain information within these records that is exempt from disclosure pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(7)(A) should also be denied pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(5), since the records consist of attorney work product and include intra-agency memoranda containing pre-decisional, deliberative material.

You may resubmit your request once the Justice Department has closed this matter, and we will be glad to provide you with any documents at that time that, if disclosed, will not jeopardize the active enforcement proceeding.

Should you wish to appeal my decision with respect to your request, you may do so by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), United States Department of Justice, 1425 New York Avenue, N. W., Suite 11050, Washington, DC 20530. Your appeal must be received by OIP within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter in order to be considered timely. The envelope should be marked "FOI/PA Appeal". You may also submit your appeal via OIP's electronic portal (at <http://www.justice.gov/oip/efoia-portal.html>). Following review by the Department, judicial review of the decision of the Attorney General is available in the United States District Court in the judicial district in which you reside, in which you have your principal place of business, or in the District of Columbia.

While our new honorable US Attorney General Loretta Lynch seems only concerned whenever fellow black citizens are gunned down by US police officers, maybe she will find time to come here



City denies councilors' briefings with monitor broke law

Six city councilors met one-on-one, or two at a time, in private this week with the court-appointed monitor overseeing reform in the Albuquerque Police Department – a potential violation of the Open Meetings Act, according to a watchdog group. (AN ACTUAL VIOLATION THAT SHOULD BE KNOWN BY BERRY'S ATTORNEY HERNANDEZ IF SHE WAS COMPETENT AS WELL AS ETHICAL-BOTH QUESTIONABLE)

City officials insisted Thursday that the briefings didn't violate the act and that there was no intent to skirt the law, which requires that public business be done in public.

The 30-minute briefings, one right after the other, happened Monday afternoon, with a councilor or two either present or on the telephone to talk with the monitor, James Ginger, a former police officer and expert appointed by a federal judge to oversee APD reform.

A four-year, \$4.5 million contract for Ginger and his firm are on next week's City Council agenda for approval, though city officials contend that's just a formality (WHO ARE THESE CITY OFFICIALS? IT'S ALSO NOT A FORMALITY UNLESS OUR CITY COUNCIL IS ABOLISHED AND WE HAVE BLESSED A MONARCHY/DICTATORSHIP) because a court order already established the monitor's office and budget. (THE COURT-FEDERAL JUDGE HAS NO APPROVAL TO COMMIT OUR TAX DOLLARS TO GINGER)

City Attorney Jessica Hernandez said Thursday that the councilors who participated in the briefings asked questions of the monitor and didn't discuss the issue with each other. (REALLY JESSICA? DOES SHE THINK WE ARE FOOLS?) They didn't take action or attempt to make a decision in private, she said.

But Greg Williams, a lawyer and president of the board of the New Mexico Foundation for Open Government, said the public should have had a chance to attend. (YES)

"It appears that the City Council violated the Open Meetings Act," he said in an interview. "A series of individual meetings on a particular topic is no different than a meeting with a quorum of members present in the same room. "This is what the law calls a rolling quorum, and it is in violation of the Open Meetings Act." Williams said the back-to-back meetings suggest the council was deliberately trying to avoid open-meetings requirements. (YES)

It's certainly appropriate, he said, for the council to be briefed on the Department of Justice investigation into the Police Department and the results of the settlement agreement, which calls for the monitoring. "We think there should be as much exchange of information as possible," Williams said, "but if it's going to involve a quorum of the City Council, then it needs to be done as part of an open meeting" in which the public has notice and can attend.

Violating the law is a misdemeanor and can result in fines or an invalidation of any action taken in private: (THEN CHARGE AND FINE THE OFFENDERS)

'Rolling quorum'

Hernandez said there was no "rolling quorum" because a majority of the council never discussed Ginger with each other. And there was no attempt to make policy or take action behind closed doors, she said. "I'm confident this is not a violation," Hernandez said. (HERNANDEZ IS-LIKE EDEN EITHER INCOMPETENT AND/ OR A WILLING STOOGUE-CONSIGLIERE FOR HER CORRUPT MOB BOSS BERRY)

KOB-TV, which first reported the meetings, has filed a complaint with New Mexico Attorney General Hector Balderas, who has enforcement power for the Open Meetings Act.

A spokesman said the complaint "has been referred to the Open Government Division for further review." The Open Meetings Act requires that any meeting of a quorum of councilors held for the purpose of "discussing public business" must be open to the public at all times.

City councilors have repeatedly expressed irritation over the last month that Ginger hadn't attended one of their regular meetings to answer questions. They have postponed action on the agenda item related to his contract, requesting Ginger attend a meeting. That's where the idea of briefings came in. DID ANY OF THE COUNCILORS ACTUALLY READ THE DISGRACEFUL AGREEMENT THAT THEY WERE NEVER ASKED TO APPROVE OR THE CUR

"The Department of Justice (JUST WHO SPECIFICALLY IN THE DOJ? DAMON MARTINEZ, VANITA GUPTA, US AG LORETTA LYNCH? had expressed some concerns that it might not be appropriate for a federal court monitor to answer questions from the council in an open meeting," said Jon Zaman, director of City Council Services. "As a result of that, the council still needed its questions answered, and so the briefings were set up." (B.S. ZAMAN IS A DISGRACE. I ONCE THOUGHT LAURA MASON WAS BAD)

Attending the meetings were Councilors Isaac Benton, Diane Gibson, Don Harris, Trudy Jones, Dan Lewis and Klarissa Peña. Three councilors didn't go: Rey Garduño, Ken Sanchez and Brad Winter. Sanchez said he had a scheduling conflict (IS THAT ALL? ARE WE TO ASSUME KEN SANCHEZ WAS OK WITH THE SECRET MEETING?), and the **Journal** wasn't immediately able to reach Winter late Thursday.

Garduño said he declined the invitation to meet privately because he believes his constituents, not just councilors, deserve to hear Ginger's answers to questions. YES

Also attending or participating by phone were U.S. Attorney Damon P. Martinez and representatives of the U.S. Department of Justice; (JUST WHO?) the city consultant and attorney who negotiates with the

DOJ on the city's behalf Scott Greenwood;,(THE LIAR TO THE COUNCIL AND DISGRACEFUL STONEWALLER STILL ON BERRY'S PAYROLL) and Hernandez.

Lewis said he simply was invited to a briefing, so he went. (THAT'S NOT AN EXCUSE-PRESIDENT REY GARDUNO WAS ALSO INVITED BUT DID NOT GO KNOWING IT WAS VIOLATION OF OPEN MEETINGS ACT) Councilors have repeatedly pushed to meet with Ginger in public, he said. "This is a direct result of the DOJ and their disdain for the City Council," Lewis said. (NOT ONLY DOJ'S DISDAIN BUT HIS MAYOR'S AND JUDGE'S DISDAIN FOR THE CITY COUNCIL AS WELL. WHY GO DAN?)

Peña said the briefings were informal, information-gathering sessions that didn't violate the Open Meetings Act. (REALLY? IT WAS CLEARLY A VIOLATION OF OPEN MEETINGS ACT) She asked about Ginger's experience and goals, she said in an interview. (HIS GOALS? HIS EXPERIENCE WAS ALREADY IN THE COUNCIL LEGISLATION-HE WAS A FORMER COP WHO MADE MILLIONS ALONG WITH HIS FELLOW FORMER COPS IN PMR INC. WHO ALSO RIPPED OFF OTHER CITIES SEEKING REFORM-LIKE PITTSBURG)

In a written statement, she added that "there was no public business being decided behind closed doors, as suggested. (REALLY MS. PENA? ARE WE FOOLS?) As you know, the Albuquerque City Council will not be deciding on the contract for Dr. Ginger, merely acknowledging the order of the federal court.

"I would have much preferred ???Dr. Ginger show up to the full council in a public forum to answer questions and I'm still hopeful that he will do that. (DON'T HOLD YOUR BREATH) Our community deserves nothing less."

The U.S. Attorney's Office (THE OFFICE? IF IT WAS DAMON MARTINEZ, SAY THIS) said it has suggested a variety of ways for city councilors to stay informed and receive information from the monitor, including participation in exit conferences during site visits. (MORE B.S. WHY THEN WEREN'T THE COUNCILORS-OUR ELECTED LEGISLATIVE BODY AND US INCLUDED IN THE NEGOTIATIONS OF THE AGREEMENT?)

But as "someone appointed to report directly to the Federal Court, it would be inappropriate for Dr. Ginger to be called to testify before a local legislative body," a spokeswoman for the office said. (MORE B.S. THEY AREN'T OUR ELECTED OFFICIALS AUTHORIZED TO SPEND OUR TAX DOLLARS. ONLY THE COUNCIL IS ELECTED TO DO THAT) "Dr. Ginger's complete monitoring reports will be available to the public." (FORMER COP GINGER KNOWS HE IS POWERLESS-CAN ONLY SUGGEST CHANGES. BUT GINGER DOESN'T CARE AS LONG AS HIS COMPANY MAKES \$4.5+ MILLION. COUNCILORS OWE HIM NOTHING)

Ginger's work stems from a settlement agreement the city reached last year with the DOJ. It was meant to resolve a federal investigation that found Albuquerque police had a pattern of violating people's rights through the use of force. (A DISGRACEFUL TOOTHLESS DOJ/BERRY AGREEMENT THAT LEFT THE COUNCIL AND WE-THE PEOPLE OUT OF THE NEGOTIATING PROCESS AND EVEN CHIEF EDEN)

The settlement requires the city to carry out a series of reforms. (NO- IT DOESN'T. GINGER CAN ONLY SUGGEST CHANGES THAT WILL PRIMARILY BE JUST MORE APD TRAINING-IT'S NOT THE SOLUTION)

It also calls for the city to pay for an independent, court-appointed monitor who will evaluate whether the city is meeting its commitment under the settlement. (WHAT SPECIFIC COMMITMENT?)

Did the city of Albuquerque and members of its city council break the law?

Balderas already has a massive document hosted online to help explain to governing bodies the Open Meetings Act, which you can read here.

Dear Board Members:

- I. In order to encompass all the fully investigated resolved cases received after June 1, 2012, I have included cases handled by a former investigator (Trey Flynt) in the office (Resolved Cases), and have created a separate sheet for the cases investigated by IA (IA Resolved).
- II. On the "Resolved Cases" spreadsheet, the average time from Receipt to the Executive Director was **171.48 days**. The average time from Executive Director to APD for review was **71.92 days**. The average time from Receipt to APD for review was **245.66 days**. The average time from Receipt to Letter to Citizen was **294.72 days**.
- III. These additional cases do not include the "investigator to executive director" date because it is missing in some cases and has not been verified in the others. For our current investigators, I included the "investigator to executive director" date after the investigators had an opportunity to review and verify the information I collected from our database and had an opportunity to fill in that date when it was missing.
- IV. I have also included a fourth page on the spreadsheet (ED days by Inv.) using the following sort:

I included the cases that were turned in to Ms. Hammer from the 80 to 119 day after receipt, i.e. the cases that most critically needed to go to APD for review promptly. The list is separated by investigator and indicates the average amount of days it took Ms. Hammer to get the cases to APD.

NOTE: Our database does not indicate whether Mr. Skotchdopole requested extensions in these cases. It is likely that he did in at least some of them. This information, and additional information concerning the IA cases and Flynt cases, could likely be discerned through pulling the physical files from IA and reviewing them, if necessary.

- V. Sheet 5 (Sustained) includes only the sustained cases from Sheet 4 (ED days by Inv.)
- VI. Percentage of Timely, Fully Investigate and Resolved cases received since June 1, 2012: "From Receipt to APD for Review"

Acting director of APD academy retires His replacement to begin job Monday

The acting director of the Albuquerque Police Academy has retired, marking the second time this year a person who oversees police training has left the department.

Lt. Michael Archibeque's last day as acting director of the academy was Friday, and he will be replaced Monday by Lt. J.J. Griego, the dayshift lieutenant for the Northeast Area Command, said Albuquerque Police Department officer Tanner Tixier, a spokesman.

Griego has been spending time with Archibeque at the police academy recently so it will be a "seamless transition," Tixier said. Archibeque took over as director in February when former director Joe Wolf resigned. Wolf, a civilian, had been in the position since July 2012.

Tixier said police only immediately considered internal candidates for the position to ensure a director was in place in a timely manner.

"At this time, we just went internal," he said. "But that's not to say that in the future we will not try to fill it with someone (from outside the department) or with a civilian."

The exodus of academy directors comes at a time when the Albuquerque Police Department is putting in place a series of reforms negotiated between the city and the U.S. Department of Justice after the DOJ investigated APD and found it had a pattern of excessive force. Many of the reforms in the settlement agreement pertain to police training.

Tixier said the academy director oversees the training of police cadets and advanced training for current officers.

Archibeque's retirement — which Tixier said was not unusual — came a week after a former instructor at the police academy filed a whistle-blower lawsuit against Archibeque, Wolf, the Police Department and Chief Gordon Eden. Tixier said the lawsuit was unrelated to Archibeque's departure.

John Corvino alleged in the lawsuit that he was retaliated against after he questioned the qualifications of an instructor who taught defense tactics to current police officers. District Attorney Kari Brandenburg has echoed Corvino's concerns about the validity of APD instructors certifications in a letter to Attorney General Hector Balderas.

"It's pretty amazing," said Thomas Grover, Corvino's attorney. "Everything that's been required to fix the department begins in the academy, and everyone is leaving."

Former Detective Vincente Alvarado said he was the instructor Corvino questioned. He disputed Corvino's allegations and said he was qualified to teach the courses.

"It's getting out of hand," he said in an interview. "The department doesn't need to be pulled into this, because I have all my certifications."

Tixier said other than the two academy directors, he was unaware of an unusually high turnover rate among other staff members and instructors at the police academy.



Let me start by saying that I too support and trust Beth, and believe that she has advocated brilliantly for the Board in her role as Acting Chair. I trust and respect each of my colleagues on the Board as well.

Having said that, I also believe that Beth has characterized the issue of the CPCs (and for that matter I would add the POB) correctly as a "**waste of time**"

This email made me very uncomfortable, and caused me to review the agenda for the City Council's meeting tonight. Not only is the resolution frustrating our efforts as a Board listed for final action, there is a R-192 proposed floor substitute which is even more restrictive and potentially hobbles the Board for months to come. It has become quite clear to me that the powers that be do not in any way want us to hear citizen complaints, a process which I believe is integral to our role as a Board, despite some Council members assurances to Dr. McCoy that in fact they do want us to review them. When the issue of the resolution was discussed at the last meeting, I repeatedly asked directly about the training requirements and how they potentially affected Board members; when my question was sidestepped, I asked directly again if those members who had not completed training could participate in the CPC process and was told that yes they could. Now, the new substitute resolution goes even further, specifically directing that those members who had not completed the training would not be allowed in the discussion or the vote with respect to CPCs.

This, combined with all the other occurrences (Deputy Chief Roseman directing CPA staff to hold Board members to a different standard with regard to certificates of completion, the meeting of stake holders that was promised to Dr. McCoy that never came about, etc., etc., etc.) lead me to the conclusion that no person nor government body really want this Board to do the job it was mandated to do in the ordinance, and will continue to create barriers so that there is an appearance of a working Board to satisfy the DOJ settlement, but that does not accomplish anything whatsoever for the citizens it is supposed to help.

I am not a man who takes kindly to having smoke blown up my ass. In my opinion we have been lied to and manipulated by the City, APD, the City Council, and the federal monitor from the very start. We have been purposefully **kept** out of the loop (as opposed to being **left** out) with no real end in sight.

Unfortunately, I for one have already **wasted** hours of time doing my job as a member of

the CPC committee, reviewing the citizen complaints with great diligence, as well as attending two separate committee meetings. But now, those citizens will again have to wait, with no resolution to their individual complaints.

In addition, I have **wasted** countless hours attending a CPA that has provided me with nothing of significance with respect to training that would benefit me as a Board member, at great cost to me personally and professionally.

I have no time for politics or for games. It is, in my opinion, highly unprofessional and unethical to keep changing the rules because the result that was expected was not what was occurring, and in fact in some cases quite embarrassing.

Rest assured that until such time as I can be convinced that somehow all of this can be better for the Board and the community in the long term, I will not be **wasting** any of my time on the business of the Police Oversight Board.

MINUTES

I. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER: Acting Chair Beth Mohr called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Board Member Ring led the Board in the Pledge.

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA - Acting Chair Mohr requested that a dinner break be added to the Agenda. Board Member Baca suggested the dinner break and Executive Session be combined. Acting Chair Mohr requested that discussion on process of how complaints will be handled to be put back on the agenda, as well as Item VII(C), training of board, and VII(D), discussion of subcommittees by Board Member Baca. Acting Chair Mohr also requested that discussion be held regarding the City Council Resolution to hold part of the Board's duties in abeyance. Board Member Fine moved the motion. Co-Chair Wilson seconded the motion. Passed.

For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Acting Chair Mohr noted that the March minutes should reflect that the meeting adjourned at 8:55 p.m. Board Member Ring moved for the approval of the minutes. Board Member Baca seconded the motion. Passed.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS –

CHARLES ARASIM – Mr. Arasim informed the Board that he has been addressing the POC for many years. He also stated that if the Subcommittee to select the new Executive Director conducts interviews in executive session, then that would constitute a violation of the Open Meetings Act. Mr. Arasim requested that the Board reject the application of Acting Executive Director Hammer as the permanent Executive Director, stating that when he previously filed a complaint, Acting Executive Director Hammer sat on the complaint for over a year.

TAD NIEMYJSKI – Mr. Niemyjski stated that he is from Poland, and was originally living in Chicago before coming to Albuquerque. He stated that he is familiar with the POC process and wanted to know if the Board is for the people. Mr. Wynosky felt that the Board should be comprised of real citizens free from politics.

DON SCHRADER - Mr. Schrader stated that all police should be tested for unhealed PTSD, and that if officers have unhealed PTSD, they should have desk jobs or work outside APD. Mr. Schrader stated that all officers should be trained to resolve situations in a non-violent manner, and that officers who have never shot or beaten a citizen should be given a special honor. Mr. Schrader stated that drug tests should be given to officers to test for drugs or steroids after being involved in any incident. Mr. Schrader stated that officers should not stalk protestors or victims' families, and that police should be respected and not feared by citizens.

ANDRES VALDEZ - Mr. Valdez stated that he is associated with an organization by the name of Vecinos United. Mr. Valdez stated that he has sued the former POC for meetings held behind closed doors, and that the Board will be in violation of the Open Meetings Act if they select the new Executive Director in a closed meeting.

VI. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT DISCUSSION/TRAINING

Acting Executive Director Hammer spoke about events leading up to the DOJ investigation of APD and their use of force. The DOJ, after completing their investigation, came out with a findings letter in April of 2014. The DOJ and the City of Albuquerque signed a Settlement Agreement in November 2014. Acting Executive Director Hammer and the Board discussed items set forth by the DOJ in the Settlement Agreement. Acting Executive Director Hammer told the Board that the Settlement Agreement is not yet an enforceable court order, but should be treated as enforceable at the present time. Acting Executive Director Hammer told the Board that Mr. Ginger requested that the Board receive training before hearing any future complaints. Board Member Amado-McCoy stated that the Board was not asked for their input. Acting Chair Mohr stated that some Board Members were scheduled to meet with the federal monitor, Mr. Ginger, but that meeting did not take place. Acting Chair Mohr commented that the Board was qualified last month, but was found to be not qualified this month. Acting

Executive Director Hammer informed the Board that Mr. Ginger, or his designee, would like to appear at the May 2015 POB meeting.

The Board discussed that there will be a backlog of cases. Acting Executive Director Hammer indicated there are CPCs ready to present, and there needs to be a game plan once the Board is up and running. The Board requested that an ongoing state-of-the-agency report be sent to the Case Review Subcommittee, to include a summary of where the CPCs (including Officer-Involved Shootings) are in the process, what information the CPCs are waiting on, and a breakdown of SOP violations. Board Member Fine made a motion that an ongoing report be made to the Case Review Subcommittee. Co-Chair Wilson seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

VII. DISCUSSION OF ROLE OF CPOA AND POB

(A) The Board and Acting Executive Director Hammer discussed the City Council Resolution to hold in abeyance POB review of CPC and Officer Involved Shooting cases until mandated training is completed. Acting Executive Director Hammer discussed training that the Board needs to complete to be in compliance with the Settlement Agreement and Ordinance, which included training in civil rights issues, citizen police academy training, ride-alongs and use of force training. Board Member Amado-McCoy stated that some Board Members are waiting on APD to schedule ride-alongs. Board Member Amado-McCoy felt the Board was comprised of civilians for a reason, that the Board was not comprised of experts, and that the Board should be neutral. Board Member Amado-McCoy suggested that building a relationship with APD may not be appropriate. Board Member Ring seconded the comments of Board Member Amado-McCoy and felt the Board should function as independently as possible. The Board expressed concerns that waiting to complete training will result in a backlog of complaints to be heard. Co-Vice Chair Wilson suggested that the first meeting of the Board may have upset some people. Board Member Amado-McCoy suggested that the Board should appear before the City Council.

Board Member Amado-McCoy made a motion that Mr. Moya arrange a meeting between Board Members and the City Council. Board Member Cruz seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring

Acting Chair Mohr spoke about an ABA Webinar being presented on April 16, 2015, on "Strategies for Success: Implementing and Improving Citizen Police Oversight of Law Enforcement." Acting Executive Director Hammer suggested the Webinar would be helpful to the Board. Acting Chair Mohr spoke about training called Foundation on Open Government being held on April 29, 2015. The City Attorney will observe the training and will provide further details on the time and location. Board Member Amado-McCoy requested that Acting Executive Director Hammer inquire of APD about special training events, and that should be a priority.

Board Member Baca spoke regarding a Policy and Procedure Subcommittee, and made a motion that the discussion be held open to the next meeting. Co-Chair Wilson seconded the motion. Discussion was had and the Board discussed creating a Policy and Procedure

Subcommittee. Members will be Co-Chair Wilson, Co-Chair Mohr, and Board Member Amado-McCoy. Board Member Baca made a motion to create the Policy and Procedure Subcommittee. Co-Chair Wilson seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

VIII. REPORTS FROM SUBCOMMITTEES

A. Outreach Subcommittee Acting Executive Director Hammer requested that guest speaker Adrian Carver be heard out of order before the dinner break. Mr. Carver made a presentation on behalf of the New Mexico Forum for Youth. Mr. Carver felt that young people should be involved with the policy-making process at many levels of government, and that young people have voices and need to be heard. Mr. Carver felt that the Youth Alliance could provide data to the Board regarding young people. He also discussed that the Youth Alliance could act in an advisory capacity to the Board, and work with the Outreach Subcommittee. The Board indicated that it would welcome input from the Youth Alliance, which will continue to work with Board Member Ring and the Outreach Subcommittee.

Board Member Fine made a motion to break for dinner. Co-Chair Wilson seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring. The Board was in recess at 7:15 p.m.

The Board reconvened at 7:49 p.m.

VIII. REPORTS FROM SUBCOMMITTEES

A. Outreach Subcommittee – Board Member Baca reported on the Outreach Subcommittee. Board Member Baca was selected to Chair the Subcommittee. Chair Waites and Board Member Ring also sit on the Subcommittee. Board Member Baca discussed the New Mexico Forum for Youth, the Outreach Coordinator position, and neighborhood associations. Board Member Baca explained how she has approached the neighborhood associations, and that the Board should become active with the neighborhood associations.

B. Personnel Subcommittee – Acting Chair Mohr discussed the search process to select the new Executive Director. The Board is bound by a Court Order to conduct interviews in an open meeting. The Board will select three names to be sent to the City Council and a CPOA staff member will assist the Board in delivery of the names to the City Council. The City Council will make the decision on who becomes the Executive Director.

Board Member Ring made a motion to accept this process to select the Executive Director as outlined. Board Member Fine seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

Acting Chair Mohr further discussed the task of the Personnel Subcommittee to select the Executive Director.

Board Member Amado-McCoy made a motion that the Personnel Subcommittee should begin their work. Board Member Baca seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

At 8:20 p.m., the Board and Assistant City Attorney Bullock met in Executive Session.

IX. DISCUSSION OF CONTRACT FOR INDEPENDENT LEGAL COUNSEL

The Board reconvened at 8:47 p.m. to discuss the contract for the Independent Legal Counsel position. There are funds available until end of fiscal year 2015. The Personnel Subcommittee should fast track the search for Independent Legal Counsel. Funds are also available beginning fiscal year 2016 for Independent Legal Counsel. Acting Chair Mohr placed an ad for the April 22, 2015, Bar Journal.

Co-Chair Wilson made a motion that the search for Independent Legal Counsel should move forward expeditiously. Board Member Amado-McCoy seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

The next meeting of the Personnel Subcommittee and the Outreach Subcommittee would be on April 27, 2015.

X. DISCUSSION OF CITY COUNCIL'S BUDGET QUESTIONS POSED TO CPOA

– Acting Executive Director Hammer presented general questions from the City Council, and provided a flow chart. Acting Executive Director Hammer discussed the process of selecting the Executive Director, the Independent Legal Counsel, and the Outreach Coordinator. Contract service for a paralegal position was also discussed. Training and Travel was also discussed.

XI. DISCUSSION OF DRAFT CPOA RULES

– Co-Chair Wilson made a motion to defer this item to a future date. Board Member Amado-McCoy seconded the motion. Passed. For: 8 – Waites, Mohr, Wilson, Amado-McCoy, Baca, Cruz, Fine, Ring.

XII. REPORTS FROM CITY STAFF:

A. Acting Executive Director Hammer – Acting Executive Director Hammer reported March 2015 statistics as follows:

17 new Citizen Police Complaints
16 Job Well Done Letters
14 Cases Resolved

A bid was placed to have the fall 2016 NACOLE conference in Albuquerque. A decision should be made in May 2015. Acting Executive Director Hammer discussed the Talk-to-a-Cop program which brings citizens and officers together. A new database being worked on, IA-PRO, will help to identify officers who may have issues.

B. SOP Update – CPOA Lead Investigator Paul Skotchdopole had nothing to report and has not attended any APD meetings as there have been no meetings of the Policy and Procedure Committee. It was discussed that Chief Eden will place Mr. Skotchdopole on the attendee list for future meetings. Board Member Amado-McCoy indicated that the Board would like the staff's input regarding the SOPs.

C. Mayor's Staff – No one was present to report.

D. City Council Staff – Mr. Moya stated that on April 20, 2015, the City Council will appoint Sue Ann Brown to serve on the Board.

E. City Attorney's Staff – City Attorney Bullock had nothing to report.

Dear Ms. Hammer --

I have substantive concerns about this agenda, which I'll itemize here. I'm writing this on the fly, and will be glad to discuss it further, but I do believe substantive changes should be made to the version I see here, ahead of our upcoming meeting, or approval of the minutes will take much longer than necessary.

1) I don't understand why item VI begins with a vague and wordy description of Robin presenting something of a brief history, when the only issue here was: "Acting Director Hammer told the Board that Mr. Ginger requested that the Board receive training before hearing any future complaints." Further, the remainder of this section glosses over the real work the Board actually did on this item, while including a history lesson from Robin that is already on record.

2) This same paragraph (VI) should only reflect the conversation we had regarding our concerns about this meeting with the federal monitor. I am recorded as saying that Board was not asked for their input about the meeting, which is true. I also made the comment that it was nonsensical to me that the Board seemed to have been deemed qualified "last month" to hear complaints, but suddenly isn't qualified this month. That was attributed to Beth. That is a simple issue of fact, which should be corrected.

3) Please clarify the second sentence in the second paragraph of this section: "Acting Executive Director Hammer indicated there are CPSs ready to present, and there needs to be a game plan once the board is up and running." I'm not sure what either of these things mean (the Board should have a "game plan," and "once the Board is up and running"), but I think if this sort of thing is to be included in the minutes, it should be contextualized and accurate.

4) In section VII -- This seems to be an attempt to summarize what I said in my extended comments RE: the meeting with Ginger, Robin's directions to us about not seeing cases, the draft of the City Council resolution she used justify her interpretation and which seemed to be direct output of this meeting, and what this interpretation 1) intrinsically claims about the meaning of "training" for our particular purposes and 2) what it claims about the very nature of this Board. I understand the need to summarize, but the three sentences attempting to represent my extended comments, and which we've been given here to approve, not only fail to capture either the letter or the spirit of my comments, it distorts them. They seem to have been plucked at random from the real argument I was making (and which the Board endorsed enthusiastically). Further, the discussion as presented here provides very little correlation to either the actual circumstances we were explicitly responding to in this part of our agenda, OR to the activity that we then moved to enact as a result of this response. For example:

a) The first sentence attempting to summarize my comments is about not being

scheduled for ride-along's. This was an aside, and inappropriate for a three-sentence summary.

b) The second of these three sentences is about the Board being designed, approved, and built as a "neutral, third party, civilian" oversight board. This was certainly central to my argument, but not summarized as delivered.

c) The third sentence devoted to the comments I delivered at our last meeting is misleading (".....suggested that building a relationship with APD may not be appropriate"). I said that if we are to consider the number of hours that we are to spend at APD training ("648 cumulative hours of training" with a single stakeholder), many community members could consider this inappropriate, and that if we're going to "train" with stakeholders, then we need to think about training with other community agencies as well.

6) You can hardly summarize my comments here without noting that the central point was this: That the question is not whether we should or shouldn't attend training, but whether or not we are capable of performing our mandated function without it. This is, after all, the discussion we were having, the agenda item we were within, and the gist of my comments.

7) Please also note at the end of this section, that the motion was for both a meeting with City councilors (specifically to discover whether the history and intent of the Resolution was accurate to the way it was presented to us) AND that I should attend the CC meeting the next week, in order to articulate our objections to the suggestion that we see no further cases until some obscure version of "training" is met (a shifting target).

It is important that the comments I made at the last meeting, that the Board endorsed, and that were accepted by the Board as a reflection of our feelings as a body, are accurately represented here. I attach to this email the written comments, from which I read. Please refer to this document, and assure that our substantive arguments regarding both 1) the shabbiness of the information/direction that was given to us by Ms. Hammer, and on which we acted in good faith, and 2) the assumptions imbedded in the version of "training" we've been presented with, are more accurately summarized.

NOTE: My written comments are my working-draft. Other addressed members of this email thread may have further recollection about the actual thrust and reality of this important meeting. AND, you always have the video version, if we need it, but we cannot approve minutes that do not accurately reflect the difficult work we're doing on this board.
