

PUBLIC NOTICE

Air Quality Construction Permit for Kirtland Air Force Base Water Plant

Kirtland Air Force Base (Kirtland AFB) has submitted a construction air quality permit application to the Air Quality Program (Program) of the City of Albuquerque Environmental Health Department for a modification to their existing Construction Permit #1786-M4. The modification is to add two (2) new 176 hp diesel-fired emergency engines, one to be located at the TAC Lab Pumping Plant and one to be located at Pump House 2 Manzano. The owner of this facility is the U.S. Air Force – Kirtland Air Force Base, 2050 Wyoming Blvd. SE, Kirtland AFB, NM 87117. This application file has been assigned Permit #1786-M5.

The Kirtland AFB Water Plant provides drinking and non-potable water to Kirtland AFB tenants and maintains a designated supply for fire protection.

The maximum air pollution emissions to the atmosphere from this facility have been estimated to be:

A copy of the permit application is available for inspection by the public at the Program offices. Interested persons may submit written comments and evidence, request a public information hearing, or both on the permit application to the Program. Comments will be accepted and considered if postmarked by the end of the public comment period on November 28, 2018. Formal action on the application will be reserved pending receipt and analysis of any additional details or information developed during the public comment period.

The Program shall hold a Public Information Hearing pursuant to 20.11.41.15 NMAC if the Director determines there is significant public interest and a significant air quality issue is involved.

The Program expects to issue, issue subject to conditions, or deny this application on or before January 15, 2019. Any person who does not participate in the permitting action will not receive notification of the Program's decision regarding the proposed permit, unless the person has delivered a written request for notice to the Program.
