

## CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS ZONING HEARING EXAMINER NOTIFICATION OF DECISION

FAMILY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT CORP (RICK DAVIS PRESIDENT FHDC, AGENT) requests a special exception to Section PG 92 DOWNTOWN NEIGHBORHOOD SDP and 14-16-2-6(E)(4)(a): a VARIANCE request of 2' to the 5' required side yard setback for a proposed new home for all or a portion of Lot 6, Block 13, BELL TRADING POST HOMES zoned SU-2 DNA-SF, located on 201 LAGUNA BLVD NW (J-13)

On the 21st day of July, 2015 (hereinafter "**Hearing**") RICK DAVIS PRESIDENT FHDC, (hereinafter "**Agent**") acting as agent on behalf of the property owner FAMILY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT CORP (hereinafter "**Applicant**") appeared before the Zoning Hearing Examiner (hereinafter "**ZHE**") requesting a Variance of 2' to the 5' required side yard setback for a proposed new home (hereinafter "**Application**") upon the real property located at 201 LAGUNA BLVD NW ("**Subject Property**"). Below are the findings of facts:

## FINDINGS:

- 1. Applicant is requesting a Variance of 2' to the 5' required side yard setback for a proposed new home.
- 3. The ZHE finds that the Applicant has met its burden of providing evidence (both oral testimony and written material) that establishes that the Application is not going to

be: (i) contrary to the public interest, (ii) injurious to the community; or (iii) injurious to the property/improvements located in the nearby vicinity of the Subject Property. Specifically, the Applicant provided testimony that the request is the same as a variance previously granted in 2005 to allow for development of detached housing units, deemed more compatible with the neighborhood's architectural and land development patterns, on unconventionally-shaped (25'X140') lots [as required pursuant to Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (2) (a)]. The requested variance will allow completion of the originally envisioned redevelopment, which constitutes a substantial benefit to the community and vicinity, and the history of the previously granted variances indicates no injury or harm to the public interest. Further, the Application and testimony of the Applicant at the Hearing suggest that there is no neighborhood opposition to the Application.

- 4. The ZHE finds that the Applicant has met its burden of providing evidence (both oral testimony and written material) that establishes that there are "special circumstances" applicable to the Subject Property which do not apply generally to other property in the same zone and vicinity. Specifically, the Applicant provided testimony that the unconventional lot shape and dimensions, which make detached housing difficult to construct, as well as the previously approved plans, constitute special circumstances[as required pursuant to Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (2) (b)]
- 5. The ZHE finds that the Applicant has met its burden of providing evidence (both oral testimony and written material) that establishes that the special circumstances presented hereinabove were not "self-imposed", and that those special circumstances create an unnecessary hardship upon the Applicant. Specifically, the Applicant provided testimony that the lot layout was preexisting and while attached units would be permissible detached units are more in keeping with the surrounding community's architecture and development patterns, which constitutes an "*unjustified limitation on the reasonable use of the Subject Property*" [as required pursuant to Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (2) (c)]
- 6. The ZHE finds that the Applicant has met its burden of providing evidence (both oral testimony and written material) that establishes that substantial justice will be done if this Application is approved. [as required pursuant to Section § 14-16-4-2 (C) (2) (d)]
- 7. Applicant provided evidence that the yellow "Notice of Hearing" signs were posted for the required time period as articulated within City of Albuquerque Code of Ordinances § 14-16-4-2 (B) (4).

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

The Applicant has met their burden of submitting an Application that provides evidence that satisfies the elements required within §14-16-4-2 (C) (2) of the Albuquerque Zoning Code.

## **DECISION:**

**APPROVAL** of a VARIANCE of 2' to the 5' required side yard setback for a proposed new home.

If you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so in the manner described below:

Appeal is to the Board of Appeals within 15 days of the decision. A filing fee of \$105.00 shall accompany each appeal application, as well as a written explanation outlining the reason for appeal and a copy of the ZHE decision. Appeals are taken at 600 2nd Street, Plaza Del Sol Building, Ground Level, Planning Application Counter located on the west side of the lobby. **Please present this letter of notification when filing an appeal.** When an application is withdrawn, the fee shall not be refunded.

An appeal shall be heard by the Board of Appeals within 45 days of the appeal period and concluded within 75 days of the appeal period. The Planning Division shall give written notice of an appeal, together with a notice of the date, time and place of the hearing to the applicant, a representative of the opponents, if any are known, and the appellant.

Please note that pursuant to Section 14. 16. 4. (B), of the City of Albuquerque Comprehensive Zoning Code, you must demonstrate that you have legal standing to file an appeal as defined.

You will receive notice if any other person files an appeal. If there is no appeal, you can receive building permits any time after the appeal deadline quoted above, provided all conditions imposed at the time of approval have been met. However, the Zoning Hearing Examiner may allow issuance of building permits if the public hearing produces no objection of any kind to the approval of an application. To receive this approval, the applicant agrees in writing to return the building permit or occupation tax number.

Successful applicants are reminded that other regulations of the City must be complied with, even after approval of a special exception is secured. This decision does not constitute approval of plans for a building permit. If your application is approved, bring this decision with you when you apply for any related building permit or occupation tax number. Approval of a conditional use or a variance application is void after one year from date of approval if the rights and privileges are granted, thereby have not been executed or utilized.
